EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT RECOMMENDATION of

11.9.2019

on Europe against Mafia

The committee of inquiry into mafia related and other criminal organizations.

Resolution on the question Europe against mafia.

- A. Considering money laundering prevention and terrorist financing as major priorities;
- B. Deeply conscious of Article 82 and Article 83 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFUE);
- C. Taking into consideration the opinion of the European Economic and Social Committee (CESE) on the Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on the freezing and confiscation of proceeds of crime in the European Union;
- D. Guided by the opinion of the Committee of the Regions about the package on protection of the licit economy;
- E. Further recalling the directive (2005/60/EC) of the EU and of the Council;
- F. Recalling the "national emission ceiling" (NEC) directive (2016/2284/EU) entered into force on 31 December 2016;
- G. Guided by the 2014 directive (2014/42/EU) on the freezing and confiscation of instrumentalities and proceeds of crime in the European Union;
- H. Further noting the 2014 EU regulation (n.513/2014) about financial support for EU's external borders and common visa policy: Internal Security Fund;
- I. Bearing in mind the recommendation passed by the United Nations against corruption;
- J. Observing the communication of the committee to "create a space for freedom, security, and justice for EU's citizens: action plan for realization of Stockholm's program" (COM2010/0107);
- K. Confident about the communication of the committee "EU's strategy of internal security: five stages to a safer Europe" (COM2010/0673);
- L. Contemplating the CE regulation n. 1889/2005 of EU's Parliament and Council regarding controls on incoming and outgoing cash from the community;

M. Having regard to regulation (EC) n.1781/2006 on information on the payer accompanying transfers of funds;

- 1. Proclaims that being a member of a Mafia-type organization is considered as a crime per se.
- 2. Endorses the raising of funds by each member State meant to support cooperation in investigations between Member States through confiscated assets, which once belonged to Mafia organizations.
- 3. Further recommends sensibilization of the public opinion about cybercrime through:
 - i. School programs meant to raise awareness on mafia's phenomena, especially in those territories particularly affected by criminal activities.
- 4. Strongly condemns toxic waste disposal. In order to obstacle communication between mafia and landowners the following action will be taken:
 - i. Controls on landowners' areas will be reinforced, in order to quickly recognize illegal movements.
- 5. Urges higher protection both on national and international level.
- 6. Encourages every national central bank to lead yearly controls over politicians' finances, in order to prevent infiltration in politics.
- 7. Deplores the election of politicians involved with ongoing court case.
- 8. Affirms that, as of 2019, one of the major priority of the European Union is the prevention of money laundering. In order to do so:
 - i. The identity of beneficial owners should be more frequent and precise, to prevent terrorist organizations from being financed.
- 9. Reaffirms that extradition requests for fugitive Mafiosi must be prioritized by receiving competent authorities.
